September 22, 1935 - July 18, 2024

Margot Helene Schulze (Bader), born on September 22, 1935, in Vaihingen/Enz, Germany,

passed away on July 18, 2024, in Rohnert Park California. She died of a heart attack and a broken heart, having had to move out of her beloved home in Grass Valley, due to old age.

Margot lived a vibrant and fulfilling life marked by her dedication to family, community, travel and culture. She was friendly, energetic and very industrious. She was a leader, a mover and a shaker.

When Margot and her late husband, Otto, moved to Grass Valley in 1991, they immediately sought out the Gold Country German-American Club and became very active and involved members.



Even after Otto's passing in 2017, Margot continued to volunteer her time and energy to the GCGAC. She always served on committees, helped plan events, gave her advice, and went on weekly hikes with the Happy Wanderers, where she shared many interesting stories about growing up in the Hitler era.

Margot was also a devout member of the Peace Lutheran Church where she volunteered in providing meals for the homeless, making gift packages to an African community the church was affiliated with, and sang in the church choir.

Margot also sang with Music in the Mountains and the Cornish Carolers Christmas Choir.

She was dearly loved by all and will be greatly missed.

There will be a Celebration of Life for Margot on September 21 from 2 to 4 p.m. at Cogir at Rohnert Park, 4855 Snyder Lane, Rohnert Park, CA 84928. That was her retirement home for the past 2 years.
