Notes from the Board

Since the end of the Covid pandemic, the Board has been struggling with the club's finances. Decreasing membership, embarrassingly low attendance at monthly club meetings, and higher rental cost for Seaman's Lodge have all contributed to a steady decrease in the club's bank account. In order to stabilize the situation, two actions were taken at the September 3, 2024 Board of Directors meeting.

First, by a vote of five ayes to zero nays, effective January 1, 2025, the annual club dues will increase to \$40.00 per year.

Second, I have taken the action to search for a less expensive venue for our club meetings. As of today (September 20, 2024) I have met with representatives of the Northstar House, The Nevada County Contractor's Association, and Peace Lutheran Church. I have contacted the Nevada County Horsemen's Association and am waiting for a reply.

On Wednesday 15 of us took off for a hike around some of the many lovely lakes. We passed Big Bear Lake, Little Bear Lake, Cub Lake, Silver Lake and Round Lake. Some folks went swimming in Round Lake, which is below an abandoned gold mine. We returned to Silver Lake and Long Lake. Some of the hikers went back to the campground at this point and some continued along the east shore of Long Lake and swam again at the dam, then back to the campground, nine miles in total. An impromptu pot luck meal sprung up with all the leftovers from the previous night, and another campfire, more lemoncello!

Thursday morning found some of us packing up early and heading to the climb up the Sierra Buttes. What luck, Jamie Hogan was able to join us (all the way from Tennessee) and we made it to the top! There were a few who were not sure they would make it, but employed the "just one more step" tactic and it worked. There was some haziness in the air because of the fire in the valley to the east, so we could not see the far distant peaks.

The very next week, on September 12, our group hiked the Mt Judah Loop, which includes part of the Pacific Crest Trail. It starts near Sugar Bowl, goes south, then east, then north, and as luck would have it, west. It is close to 6 miles. There are some interesting geologic formations along the way. The top itself is a bit uninteresting but the 360 degree view is fantastic.



Teutonic Technology: Giga-Train



Compare these two commuter trains. On the left is the standard S-Bahn electric train in Munich, using the standard overhead wiring and "catenaries" held high by somewhat unattractive towers. On the right is a new train, developed by Tesla, that is entirely battery-operated. It is called the Giga Train, and it carries passengers, most of whom are Tesla employees, from Erkner station east of Berlin, Germany, to the Tesla factory 20 miles south. This train route has no catenaries; it formerly used diesel locomotives. It is anticipated that the Giga Train will transport 4,500 workers to and from the factory every day, 500 riders per trip. One can only imagine the bank of lithium-ion batteries needed to propel a train, and how such a bank of batteries would be recharged.
