### **About Lebkuchengewürz**

One of Germany's most popular and beloved Christmas treats is Lebkuchen. The authenticity of these gingerbread cookies relies heavily on the mixture of spices (gewürz) used. Here is a formula for making your own authentic Lebkuchengewürz:

All ingredients are ground and mixed as shown at right:

2.5 TBsp cinnamon  
2.0 tsp cloves  
0.5 tsp allspice  
0.5 tsp coriander  
0.5 tsp cardamom  
0.5 tsp ginger  
0.5 tsp star anise  
0.25 tsp mace  
0.25 tsp nutmeg

# Teutonic Technology -- Hansgrohe Dog Shower

**Hansgrohe** is a German plumbing materials and sanitary fittings manufacturer based in Schiltach, Baden-Württemberg, Germany. Founded in 1901 by Hans Grohe, the Hansgrohe company is one of the world's largest manufacturers of shower heads, hand showers, and high-styled faucets for kitchen and bathroom. They patented the kitchen faucet with a pull-out hand sprayer in common use today. Among their product offerings is a specialized hand-held shower for dogs, as shown at right.

Features of the Hansgrohe Dog Shower: Each of the "bristles" in the brush is a hollow water squirter by which the dog groomer can penetrate long fur to the dog's skin beneath. A switch on the sprayer converts the full spray to a smaller spray for cleaning the dog's legs. A third switch position diverts the water to a single outlet for gently cleaning dirty paws. The sprayer switch can be operated with one hand, presumably while the owner's other hand is holding the dog in place in the bathtub. The Hansgrohe web site shows several photos of dogs, happily being bathed, unrestrained, even though every self respecting dog's primary instinct is to jump out of the bath and to shake vigorously, flinging dog bathwater on to its owner and the walls of the bathroom. Is there something about the Hansgrohe Dog Shower that prevents that behavior?
